





Total Estimated Population by Age Group, Bradford County and Florida, 2014-2018





High School Graduation Rates by School Year, Bradford and Union Counties and Florida




High School Dropout Rates by School Year, Bradford and Union Counties and Florida





Highest Level of School Completed, Bradford and Union Counties and Florida, 2014-2018











Per Capita Income, By Race and Ethnicity, 2014-2018




Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed (ALICE) Households in Bradford County, 2018




All Causes (Age Adjusted Death Rates, 2015-2019)






Cancer (Age Adjusted Death Rates, 2015-2019)






Heart Disease (Age-Adjusted Death Rates, 2015-2019)






Chronic Lower Respiratory Disease (CLRD) (Age-Adjusted Death Rates, 2015-2019)






Unintentional Injury (Age-Adjusted Death Rates, 2015-2019)








Years of Potential Life Lost (YPLL) Measures Premature Death





Infant Mortality by Race and Ethnicity






Mental Health Hospitalizations

Mental Health Hospitalization Rates per 1,000 Population, Bradford County Residents and Florida, 2015 - 2019




Emergency Department Visits

Mental Health Emergency Department Visit Rates per 1,000 Population, Bradford County Residents and Florida, 2015 - 2019




Opioid and Drug Overdose Deaths

Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome (NAS)

 - Most commonly associated with opioids, but other substances, including nicotine, can be implicated

Background

- National health-related telephone survey
- Used since 1984
- Self-reported indicators
- Allows for comparisons at the state and national level







Key Findings – Community Themes and Strengths

Primary data collected by the community survey and focus groups. It includes the perspectives and opinions of Bradford County residents on health issues.

Community Survey

Community Survey

- 175 respondents from Bradford County (3 times more than 2017)
 - 83% Female, 14% Male
 - 79% White, 8.6% Black, 96% Non-Hispanic
 - Ages:
 - 4.6% 18-24,
 - 5.1% 25-29,
 - 15.4% 30-39;
 - 19.4% 40-49,
 - 27.4% 50-59,
 - 17% 60-70
 - 10.3% 70+

- 74% Employed Full-Time
- 68.6% Health Insurance through job
- 15.4% Medicare
- 10.9% Medicaid
- 10.3% Paid for own health insurance

Factors that Define a Healthy Community (top 5 responses)

- Access to health care (65.7%)
- Good schools (32.6%)
- Access to convenient, affordable and nutritious foods (30.3%)
- Job opportunities for all levels of education (29.7%)
- Low crime and safe neighborhoods (17.1)

Behaviors with the Greatest Negative Impact on Overall Health (top 5 responses)

- Drug abuse (69.7%)
- Lack of personal responsibility (30.3%)
- Eating unhealthy food/drinking sugar sweetened beverages (29.7%)
- Alcohol abuse (23.4%)
- Not using health care services appropriately (18.9%)

Biggest Health Problems for Bradford County (top 5 responses)

- Substance abuse/drug abuse (36.6%)
- **Obesity** (29.7%)
- Mental health problems (27.4%)
- Access to sufficient and nutritious food (17.7%)
- Child abuse and neglect (16.6%)

Health Care Services that are Difficult to Obtain in Bradford County (top 5 responses)

- Specialty care (38.9%)
- In-patient hospital care (33.7%)
- Imaging (such as CT scan, MRI) (32.6%)
- Alternative medicine/alternative therapy (30.3%)
- **Urgent care** (24.6%)

Barriers to Getting Needed Health Care Services

- 22.3% of respondents didn't get the primary care they needed
- 61.5% because of **cost**, 38.5% because **no appointments** available 32.6% of respondents didn't get the **dental care** they needed
 - 70.2% due to **cost**, 31.6% because of **insurance** issue
- 13.1% of respondents didn't get the **mental health or substance use care** they needed
 - 47.8% due to **cost**, 34.8% because of **insurance** issue, 30.4% because **no appointments** available

Two Biggest Challenges in the Last 12 Months (all responses)

- None were challenges for me (49.1%)
- Mental health/depression (14.9%)
- Affordable utilities (11.4%)
- Food (having enough nutritious food) (10.9%)
- Access to doctor or dentist (9.1%)
- Childcare (8%)
- Employment (6.9%)
- Transportation (4%)
- Housing (4%)
- Personal safety (3.4%)



Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic on Health Behaviors

- Increased tobacco use (4.6%)
- Increased alcohol use (9.7%)
- Decreased alcohol use (5.1%)
- Increased drug/substance use (1.1%)
- Delayed getting health care services (48.6%)
- Household has an emergency plan (77.1%)

Focus Groups

Focus Group Key Findings

2 Focus Groups

- September 23, New River Health Care, 6 participants
- October 21, Community Leaders, Virtual Format, 6 participants
 - Participants represented both Bradford and Union Counties
 - Covered topics such as
 - Pressing, persistent health issues
 - Impact of education, jobs, affordable housing, transportation and food security on health
 - Groups with unequal access to care and services, and groups with higher risk of poorer health outcomes and quality of life

Focus Group Key Findings

Important, pressing health issues/problems and behaviors

- Diabetes, COPD, high blood pressure, STDs, infant mortality
- Poor nutrition leads to chronic conditions (diabetes, heart disease)
- Substance abuse
- Tobacco use

Access-related issues/problems

- Lack of adult dental care is persistent problem
- Limited services for senior citizens
- Hospital closure compounded access problem
- Transportation

Focus Group Key Findings (continued)

Challenges with meeting basic needs

 Education, jobs, housing, transportation and food (social determinants of health) are persistent, underlying problems

Barriers to good health, quality of life

- Low health literacy
- Fear of being judged, local social norms, generational practices

Strengths and resources

- Local churches and non-profit organizations including food banks
- Some specialty services returning to the ara

Other needs

- Leadership, modeling of healthy behaviors
- More collaboration among agencies, counties, regional partners
